

This is a community which strives to worship and serve God together. Within this community, people freely explore their personal questions about God and the Bible. It's together that we can better learn the breadth and depth of the Gospel and how it works out in our lives. Then, through the grace and hope of the gospel, we serve those in need and work together towards a thriving community.

This program is organized under five headings as described below:

Gathering: We remember God of Creation. The creator is amazing, perfect, powerful, good and is worthy of our worship and praise. This helps center and prepare our hearts for a time of worship.

Confession and Renewal reminds us that this world is not as God originally intended it. We express our grief and sorrow over the brokenness of this world and of our own lives. Our need for grace never goes away, and it is only by faith in Jesus that we can be made right with God. Within these words of renewal we recognize the truth that God's redemption of his people has been accomplished in Jesus.

Thanksgiving is our response to the redemptive plan of God. It is also an opportunity to express our thanks tangibly.

Ministry of the Word is expressed through reading our scripture passage for the day, listening to the Word preached, and responding with words of prayer from the congregation.

The *Benediction* is a good word to be sent out on.

We encourage you to spend some time before the service begins and note how it flows. You are also encouraged to take this bulletin with you to use for personal devotional time throughout the week.

Reflections are from Today's Sermon:

Money has a great power over us. In itself, money is neither good nor bad. The problem is money never exists in itself. It always exists in somebody's life, and there it magnifies and amplifies whatever is in the heart. For example, Proverbs 10:16, is a fascinating verse and says, "The wages of the righteous is life, but the earnings of the wicked are sin and death." It's a very striking statement.

It says in verse 11, "The wealth of the rich is their fortified city; they imagine it a wall too high to scale." We're being told that of all the things of the world you could look to, to give you what only God can give you, of all the possible God substitutes, of all the things that most seem to offer what God can give you, it's money. We should be running into the name of the Lord for our significance and security, but we use money. How so? Money offers to be not just money. It offers to be your god by giving you a false sense of security, giving you an inflated identity, and fueling your idolatries.

The more you sow your seed, the more you will reap fruit, but the more you hoard your seed, the less you'll eat. The more you sow, the more you reap. The less you sow, the less you eat. It's an agricultural metaphor and it's crucial to realize that. ... When you scatter your gifts to the poor, you're uniting society. If the well-off hold on to their money and spend it all on themselves, you have a divided society. Gathering, which means hoarding, scatters, but scattering gathers. If you give your money away to the church, the job of the church is to bring God and humanity together. We're going to sing about it in "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing" in a few weeks. "God and sinners reconciled." It's uniting God and humanity.

Invitation to the Table

- L This is the joyful feast of the people of God! People will come from east and west, from north and south, and sit at the table in the kingdom of God. When our risen Lord was at table with his disciples, he took the bread, and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him. This is the Lord's table. Our Savior invites those who trust him to share the feast that he has prepared.
- A We receive this food gladly, believing, as we eat, that Jesus is our lifegiving food and drink and that he will come again to call us to the wedding feast of the Lamb.


